- **SUBJECT:** Upcoming precertification requirement for non-emergent inpatient transfers including ambulance transport

This bulletin is to remind you of an upcoming precertification requirement for non-emergent inpatient transfers including ambulance transport.

Beginning January 1, 2019, AmeriHealth HMO, Inc. and AmeriHealth Company of New Jersey (collectively, AmeriHealth New Jersey) will require precertification for all non-emergent transfers from one inpatient acute-care setting to another inpatient acute-care setting as well as non-emergent land and air ambulance transports.

To ensure our members receive services that are most cost-effective, it is important that when transferring an AmeriHealth New Jersey member to another facility for non-emergent services, the following requirements are satisfied:

- precertification is obtained
- the transfer is medically necessary
- the receiving hospital participates in the member's AmeriHealth New Jersey network

Please note that the method for requesting precertification differs depending upon the type of service and who requests it.
